DIRECTIONS

Habersham High School
2059 State Hwy 197
Mt. Airy, GA 30563

(Entrance door is between main entrance and gymnasium on the right)

From Atlanta/Gainesville Area

Take I-85 North out of Atlanta. Take the I-985 North exit. North of Gainesville exit 24, I-985 becomes GA 365, continue North until you come to Clarkesville/Mt. Airy Exit (Highway 197) just past the 49 mile marker. Exit there and at the end of the ramp turn right. High School will be on the right.

From Toccoa

Take Highway 17 (Bypass) toward Cornelia. Continue straight and that becomes Highway 365. At the Tom Arrendale interchange follow 365 South going toward Cornelia/Gainesville/Atlanta. You will exit on Highway 197 Clarkesville/Mt. Airy exit. (When exiting you will turn left and cross back over the north-bound lanes.) At the end of the exit turn right. Habersham High School will be on the right.

From Commerce/Athens Area

Take 441 North to Baldwin, Continue on 441 North and go past Belk's on your right. 441 will merge into 365. Follow it until you come to the Clarkesville/Mt. Airy Exit (Highway 197) just past the 49 mile marker. When you exit turn right at the end of the exit ramp. Habersham High School will be on the right.
